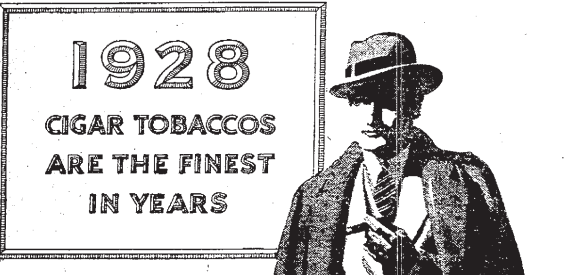
UNION TACKLES SLIPPERY ROCK AWAY, ON FRIDAY

Will Try To Prolong Unfeated Record; Stiff Practices Are Planned

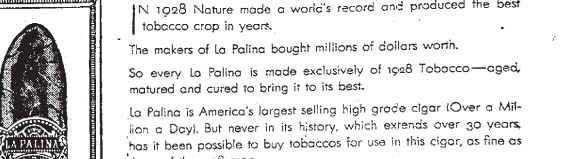
On Friday, November 8, the undefeated Union high school football team will be called upon to travel to Slippery Rock to face what is expected to be one of the stiffest tests of the season.
